David S. Post, Ph.D.

David S. Post, Ph.D., 55, of Lake Charles died Friday, June 03, 2005 in his residence.

Dr. Post was born March 14, 1950 in Washington, DC and lived most of his young life in Alexandria, VA. He graduated from Virginia Tech University in 1972 with a Bachelor's degree in Science and Psychology. He then married his wife of thirty-two years, Patricia Davis Post, Ph.D. In 1977 Dr. Post completed his Ph.D. in Psychology at Texas Tech University and from 1977-1980, he served his clinical internship at William Beaumont Army Medical Center in El Paso, TX. He served as director of the Outpatient Psychiatry and Psychology Service at Bayne Jones Army Hospital in Fort Polk, LA. In 1980, Dr. Post entered private practice in Clinical Psychology and Clinical Neuropsychology with The Psychology Clinic in DeRidder, LA and in Lake Charles, LA. In 1999, he attained his Post-Doctoral Master's degree in Clinical Psychopharmacology from the California School of Professional Psychology. He was the President Elect of the Louisiana Psychological Association and was affiliated with the American Psychological Association: Division 40- Neuropsychology, and Division 50- Pharmacotherapy, the National Academy of Neuropsychology, and he was an executive committee member of the LA Psychological Association and the LA Academy of Medical Psychologists. Dr. Post received the Karl S. Heiser Presidential Award in July 2004 and received the Excellence in Advocacy Service Award from the American Psychological Association. He was a member of St. Luke-Simpson United Methodist Church. The Doctors Post served as co-chairs of the Annual Giving Fund for Episcopal Day School.



He had a passion for music and as a high school

student was such an accomplished pianist that his parents allowed him to play in clubs in the Washington, DC area, even on school nights. His true love was his family. His heart belonged to his wife and to his daughters who he thought were the greatest.

He is survived by his loving wife, Patricia Davis Post, Ph.D. of Lake Charles; two daughters, Allison Davis Post and Catherine Davis Post, both of Lake Charles; step- mother, Doris "Brownie" Post of Fairhope, AL; one sister, Susan Hamlin and husband Bob and niece Katie, of Daphne, AL; one brother, Kevin Post and wife Penny and niece Stephanie, of Richmond, VA; parents-in-law, Red and Ida Davis of Austin, TX; three brothers-in-law: Donald Davis and wife Cheryle and nieces Brooke and Erin of Clarendon Hills, IL, Bill Davis and wife Sharon Menasco-Davis and nieces Lauren and Celest of Austin, TX and Bruce Davis and wife Lisa and niece Kathryn and nephew Hunter of Ashland, KY. He leaves behind well-loved colleagues and staff at The Psychology Clinic of DeRidder and Lake Charles and colleagues at the Louisiana Academy of Medical Psychologists and the Psychological Association.
